DEBATING PROGRAM TO OPEN SATURDAY

Pitt Representatives To Speak In Intercollegiate Forum On N. R. A. Features

Supplanting the usual International Debate, an Intercollegiate Forum will feature the first seasonal program under the supervision of the Forensic Council when two University of Pittsburgh speakers meet two members of the College debating team in Schwab auditorium at 7:30 o'clock Saturday night.

The topic of the forum reads, "Should the essential features of the N. I. R. A. be adopted as the permanent policy of the United States?" As the forum plan has been modified to meet local conditions, each representative will speak for twelve minutes and then will be allowed a short period in which to restate his views or criticize other views expressed.

May Question Speakers
Under the forum plan, members of the audience may ask questions of the speakers or contribute their own viewpoints. The discussion is closed by an authority in the field of discussion who points out the weaknesses of the ideas presented or gives his own views. is provided by the granting of licenses to restaurants, hotels, and clubs. Hotels must have at least six permanent bedrooms for the use of guests and a public dining room large enough to accommodate forty persons. It also specifies that there be a kitchen apart from the public dining

room. Restaurants are required to have a floor space of not less than five hundred feet equipped with tables and chairs to accommodate at least fifty persons at one time. At least three
