GLENNLAND A. C. WINS FIRST MEET

Natators Down Johnstown A. C. By 48-10-13 Score—Take Five First Places

Scoring five firsts and six second places in their opening meet of the season, Glennland A. C. decisively trounced Johnstown A. C. last Tuesday night, 48-10-13.

Marty Hart, Glennland, won the 50-yard freestyle in 27.5 seconds, with Johnny Keech, a teammate, taking second. Paul Johnson, former 100-yard champion of Philadelphia, took that race in 1 minute 4 3/5 seconds, while Hart again came through, placing second.

Geiger Wins Breaststroke Event In the 220-yard freestyle event, Ben Dern, former eastern P. R. R. champ, took first honors in 2 minutes 48 seconds. Jim Cummings placed second. The 90-yard backstroke went to Zubrod, of Johnstown, with Bob Miller, Glennland natator, second. Dick Geiger, Tri-State backstroke record holder and former Penn A. C. man, easily won his event in 1 minute 5 seconds, with Lou Hinman, formerly of the Spa Swimming association, of St. Petersburg, taking second honors.

Lion Coach Gives Eastern Team Even Chance For Victory Despite Long Trip

"Columbia University is a logical choice for the Rose Bowl game on New Year's Day, even though they are not among the undefeated teams in the East this year."

Earle E. "Spike" Leslie, line coach of the Lion gridmen and head basketball coach, was the speaker. "Princeton, of course, was the natural selection for the game, but, since an agreement with Yale not to play again following the Princeton-Yale game prevented them from going, the invitation to Columbia was only logical."

Big Ten team, would have been an excellent choice, but they have a conference ruling against post-season games, too.
"This Columbia team will be able to give a good account of itself," the Lion line coach said, recalling the Penn State-Columbia game last October. "It will be the first time a New York City team has played in the Tournament of the Roses and that will add color to the game. Pitt had its chance last year."
Asked what the chances were for an eastern victory, Leslie was inclined to give Columbia an even break. "They'll be able to give a good account of themselves despite such a long trip. The Columbia athletic authorities have been wise enough to plan their team's schedule so that the players will arrive on the Coast with about a week to recover from the long train ride and acclimate themselves," Leslie pointed out.
And the Lion line coach should know what's what about things on the Coast. He spent his undergraduate days at Oregon University, playing a tackle position when he wasn't serving with the A. E. F.
Coincidences do not always appear in fiction alone. Leslie played freshman football in 1916 when Hugo Bezdek was head coach for the Webfoots. So, the freshman tackle and the head coach of 1916 became coach and an athletic director, respectively, at the same institution in 1932.
Leslie was a fullback until he reported for practice under Bezdek. "What position do you play?" the then Oregon coach asked.
"I'm a fullback," Leslie answered.
"O. K. From now on you're a tackle," Bezdek said. And the varsity proceeded to come up against the toughest opposition that they met all that season.
