**Is the NRA Constitutional?**

in 1922 shows that while Congress may not assume regulatory power over the matter of a purely local nature, it may provide national regulation and apply it to any and all local conditions that affect workmen and rates associated with or affecting interstate commerce.

"It is reasonable to suppose that the Supreme Court will sustain the Industrial Recovery Act on the ground that

Congress in its power to regulate interstate commerce must be permitted to pass laws to make such regulation effective," Dr. Tanger said. "It may choose the means to attain the end."

During the current depression, Dr. Tanger believes that local trade and transportation problems have been closely associated with those of interstate trade and transportation.

"With this point of view, the Supreme Court cannot sustain the position taken by Judge Akerman with respect to local cleaners and dyers," he

continued. "As to the other two constitutional questions raised, he concluded, "suffice it to say there is ample argument either from the standpoint of emergency, precedent, or trend of Supreme Court opinion to dispose of them in like manner as the first."
