Sackett To Attend Athletic Conclave

Meeting to consider the advisability of organizing a Pennsylvania intercollegiate athletic conference, delegates from forty or more colleges in this State will convene in Harrisburg Saturday morning at the call of President Ralph D. Hetzel, head of the Pennsylvania Association of College Presidents.

A member of the faculty not officially charged with the coaching or management of athletic teams will represent each institution. Dean Robert L. Sackett, of the School of Engineering will represent the College. Final decision on whether or not a regular association to govern eligibility rules and subsidization should be formed will be made at that time.

Dr. Joseph S. Roucek, professor of the sociology department, will speak to the members of Pi Gamma Mu, honorary social science fraternity, on the subject of "Political Behavior in the Balkans" in the Hugh Beaver Room, 4:15 o'clock Monday afternoon.

Botanist Returns to College After Study of Tropical Plants in Siam

After seven years spent as an instructor in primary schools and colleges in Bangkok, Siam, Miss Hilda S. Cunniff has returned to Penn State to finish work on her M. A. and Ph. D. degrees in the department of botany.

"It is the ambition of every botanist to visit tropical countries and study their flora first hand," Miss Cunniff says. She was given this unusual opportunity while doing graduate work and teaching in the department of botany here in 1926 when her stepfather, Mr. Raymond B. Stephens, was appointed Advisor in Foreign Affairs to the King of Siam.

While here, Miss Cunniff has resumed her position as assistant in the botany department under Dr. J. B. Hill, acting head of the department. Miss Cunniff plans to return to Siam when her work here is finished.
