Turnbull Eligible As Lion Boxers Prepare for Navy

With Lion ringmen conditioning for their foreign encounter with Navy, a formidable slugger, who may possibly appear on the Nittany card at Annapolis Saturday night, appeared out of the blue Tuesday afternoon when it was definitely announced that Alex Turnbull of last year's varsity squad is still eligible for competition. Turnbull, barred because of the former eight-semester ruling, became eligible under the new athletic code which permits an athlete to hold a position on a varsity sport team three seasons. Since Turnbull appeared on a varsity mit card during only one season, he may still fight this year.

Coach Leo Houck stated that there is a possibility that Turnbull, who has been working out all week, may replace Paul Ferrero as the entry in the 155-pound division. There is also a chance that he might fight in one of the heavier classes, although Leo was not over-communitive on this point. Last Saturday the Annapolis ringmen bowed to Virginia 5-to-3 in a meet in which one of the three Naval wins was garnered via the forfeit route. The Navy men matched the Lions in performance against Western Maryland since the Annapolis

team recently defeated Coach Dick Harlowe's mitmen by a 5-to-3 count. Bob Watkins and Tommy Slusser will probably take the ring against two of the best of the Navy ringmen namely, Blitch, 135, and Lambert, 175, who gained the only Navy victories in the Virginia contest. Captain McNaughton, 155, who was absent from the line-up against the southerners, will also give his Lion opponent plenty of trouble since the only bout he ever lost was to Dynamite Joe Moran, of Syracuse, last year.

Nebel To Meet Peppard
Frank Nebel will probably be the Houck selection to oppose Peppard of Navy in the 165-pound division, while Criswell will meet Chet Smith in the 115-pound class, and Mike Zeleznok will oppose Mulquin in the 125-pound division. Red Palsin will face Nautman of Navy in the 145-pound title. The Houckmen are looking for sure victories in these bouts; they will probably forfeit in the unlimited class since they lack an opponent for Cutter, Navy representative. Workouts at the Recreation hall yesterday were fast with every candidate showing as much stuff as possible in an effort to gain favor in the eyes of Coach Houck.

HAMAS LEFTS MAX INTO DECISION LOSS

Ex-Lion Ringman Pounds Out 12-Round Triumph to Near Title

The left he learned under Coach Leo Houck while a Lion ringman helped Steve Hamas definitely establish himself as one of the outstanding challengers for the heavyweight championship through the medium of a 12-round decision over Max Schmeling, former title-holder, in Convention hall, Philadelphia, Tuesday night. Hamas, who was graduated from the College in 1929 after winning the Intercollegiate heavyweight title, won eight rounds to the Black Uhland's four, and had Dan Moxie hanging on the ropes in the eighth and ninth. The former Lion ringman, however, couldn't land the finishing punch and Max finished strongly.
