A. student mid-winter conference to be held there Friday and Saturday. The conference, which is sponsored by the National Student Council, will take up and attempt to solve some of the problems confronting modern Christians.

TRIBUNAL FINDS 7 FRESHMEN GUILTY

5 Men Released From Charges; Rest To Wear Signs, Cans For Breaking Customs

Seven freshmen, the largest number this year, were convicted of infractions of customs and sentenced by Student Tribunal last night. The meeting, under the direction of C. William Anderson '34, president, also found five first-year men not guilty. Robert J. Senton '37, found guilty of breaking dress customs and dating, was sentenced to wear two number ten tin cans tied to his ankles and sandwich boards carrying the words "I Was the King," and "Customs Are Still Enforced." William E. Graf-fam '37 will wear the sign "Tribunal Caught up With Me" for not wearing dress customs. Walter H. Blake '37 will wear a sign saying "Dear Diary, I Met Tribunal."

"Second-Offender" Released
"Another Customs Breaker" is the legend to be worn by George F. Kan-yuck '37 for dress customs and dating infractions. Frank R. Schlow '37 was excused on charges of not wearing dress customs. Albert Lasko '37, a repeater, was tried on charges of not wearing customs and not fully carrying out a former sentence. He was reprimanded and excused.

Michael R. Shehadi '37 was convicted of walking on the grass and sentenced to go from his room in Frear hall to the North Liberal Arts building on barrel stave skis. Hal-deman S. Wertz '37 was excused on charges of breaking dress rules. Richard E. Whittaker '37 was found not guilty on the same charge.

"Tribunal in the Raw Is Seldom Mild" is the slogan to be exhibited by George Ollendike '37 for violations of dress customs. Arthur G. Ciannacco '37 was found guilty of not wearing a dink and will wear the signs, "Tribunal Chief—Hands out Grief," and "Bare Hair; Think! Dink." Charles E. 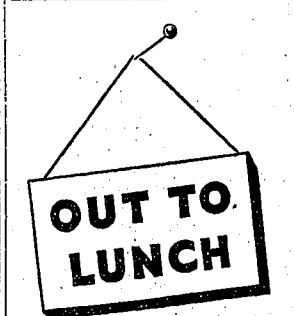

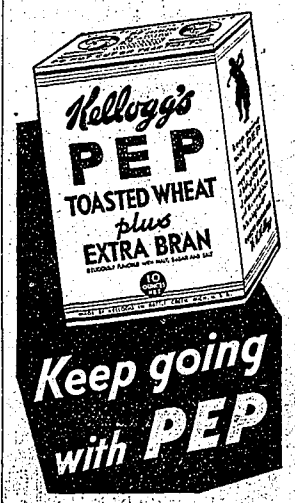
