Super Salesmen For Penn State Found in Its Alumni, Relatives
Alumni and relatives seem to be the best salesmen for Penn State.

Of the freshmen in the School of Agriculture, who were polled to determine why they had selected Penn State instead of any other college, seventy-seven of the 118 who voted replied that pop talks by alumni and relatives had been instrumental in their coming here.

Fifty-three claimed the curricula of that school had attracted them; low expenses were mentioned by seventeen; and former visits to the College influenced twelve. Other incentives listed were recommendations from former teachers, rural location of the College, and the College catalogue.

Factors mentioned from one to three times were magazine articles, Penn State spirit, county agents, facilities of the College, fraternity life, senatorial scholarships, and the climate.

the heavyweight class, complete the Harvard entries.

Pennsylvania will send Levine, 118-pounder, Moore, 126-pounder, Gordon, 135-pounder, and either Mazursky, Bowman or De Prophetis in the 145-pound weight. Fry will fill the 155-pound berth, Lee or Clark the 165, while it is still undecided whether Basmajian, Lee, Gram, or Clark will start in the 175-pound class. Either Cross or Basmajian will be the Red and Blue heavyweight.

Snowden Will Compete
Yale submitted only eight entries, the only team as yet which named no alternates. Coopersmith, Valas, Shalenderger, Hull, Captain Haase, Kindeke, Triest, and Snowden are the Bulldog entries. Snowden lost in the finals last year to "King" Cole for the heavyweight title.

Columbia, too, submitted only a tentative line-up with Lustbader and Papastamatiou in the 118-pound division, Chilvers and McGrath in the 126-pound class, and Brown or McGrath in the 135-pound class. In the 145-pound division, the New York Lions will enter either Klinger, Brown, or Nebel; in the 155-pound class, Johnson or Klinger will wrestle. Johnson or Kelly will start in the 165-pound division, while King and Acer are both named as 175-pounders. Davenport or King will be the Columbia heavyweight.

Princeton will be represented by either Koehler or Avati, 118-pounders, Gurney or Snelham, 126-pounders, Bowie or Quinn, 135 pounds, and Gregory or Wesiman in the 145-pound division. Captain Hooker will be a strong factor in the 155-pound division. There are three Princetonian possibilities in the next class—Elliott, Treide, or Prindle. Classen, Schmidlapp, or Elliott will compete in the 175-pound division, while Buckman is the Tiger heavyweight.

Lehigh Has Perfect Slate
Lehigh is the only team to enter the tournament with a perfect record, boasting nine victories and no losses or ties. The Nittany grapplers have the second best season behind them, with four victories, one loss and one tie, closely followed by Yale with four victories against two defeats.

Harvard with four victories, three defeats, and one draw for the season, and Princeton, with three victories, two defeats and a draw, follow closely. Pennsylvania has a 500 storage of three victories against three losses. Columbia has the least impressive

average with three victories overshadowed by six defeats and a tie. Cornell has engaged in the least number of dual meets, having taken part in only four, winning two while losing and tying one each. Syracuse, with two victories, four defeats, and a tie, concludes the list.

Lytle Addition Juvenile Religionists Not Daunted by Theological Enigma

Nursery rhymes and theology are but slightly differentiated by youngsters at the Lytle's Addition Community Sunday School where the Penn State Christian Association is aiding with the instruction of its members.

"Cain, Abel and Pinchot were the first children of Adam and Eve," was a response to one of the questions put yesterday morning by Mary L. McFarland '34 and John A. Cartmell '36 P. S. C. A. members during the instruction hour.

The work at the Addition, until recently wholly in the hands of the As-

sociation, now has the assistance of the Women's Club and Parent-Teachers' Association of State College. The children receive instruction in handicraft each Saturday.

Average attendance at the Sunday school is between twenty-five and fifty squirming children. Several of the older boys are building benches for those who have been compelled to stand each week.

Adults often attend the Sunday school although many of them are handicapped by their inability to read and consequently cannot use the hymn books. The children are fond of entertaining their parents and enjoy giving lengthy programs where they recite poems.

The making of paper furniture for doll houses became so fascinating at the handicraft class last Saturday that before the afternoon period was over, older boys and girls were busy at it, too. Picturesque Bible stories are favorites with the children and many ingenious explanations are advanced to explain them by young and imaginative minds.

\$400 DONATED TO COLLEGE FOR MUSHROOM EXPERIMENTS

Mason Chief Penn Hope Mason, 145-pounder from the University of Pennsylvania, will probably be the chief hope of the Philadelphia school at the tourney. The other two Penn men are Bochman in the 125-pound class, and Elfant, in the 115-pound division.

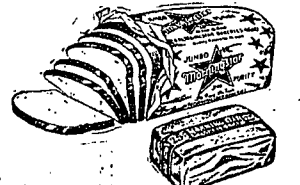
The most promising entry from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology is Captain Carey, who fights in the 145-pound division. Three teammates will accompany him to the tourney: Brooks, 125; Wetherill, 135; Jewitt, a heavyweight.

Pruitt Probably Out
Lion mitemen will drill hard through the early part of this week and final selections will be announced in about three days. The nose injury which Briggs Pruitt suffered in the Army tilt Saturday will probably place him on the disabled list as far as the intercollegiate is concerned.

Nebel, who has been fighting out of his class most of the season, will probably be the Lion entry in the 155-pound class where he will have an opportunity to try his mettle against some opponents with whom he is evenly matched in weight.
