155-pound division, and pinned him with a bar arm after six and a half minutes. In the meantime, Hooker, of Princeton, and the defending champion, pushed Hull, of Yale, all over the mat to roll up eight minutes and thirty seconds' time advantage. This will bring last year's finalists together again.

"Red" Johnston pushed Crockett, of Lehigh, all over the mat, and although he had him nearly on his back several times, he couldn't throw him. He got eight minutes and a half time advantage to clinch a final berth in the 165-pound class.

Elliott, Princeton, and Emery, Harvard, had no advantage at the end of ten minutes, but after two extra periods, Elliott won with a time advantage of two minutes, fifty-six seconds in the other bracket of the 165-pound division.

Snowden Tosses Orangeman

Kreizman lost one of the toughest bouts so far. He had the edge over Aranson, of Harvard, but the Crimson 175-pounder got a body hold, and reverse chancery on him and the Lion dropped a heart-breaker in seven minutes fifty-eight seconds.

Triede, Princeton 175-pounder, took Ed King, Columbia, into camp with a time advantage of three minutes and one second to enter the finals.

In the first of the heavyweight semi-finals, Snowden defeated Captain Hordines, Orangeman, in an extra-period bout with a time advantage of three minutes, forty-four seconds. Scobey, of Lehigh, was too powerful for Barrows, Cornell heavyweight, and defeated him with six minutes and fifty-seven seconds of time advantage.

Lehigh Places Five

When Lou Kreizman rolled up a time advantage of six minutes, forty-five seconds in the last match of the afternoon, Penn State went into the lead for the number of men qualifying for last night's semi-finals. Bob Ellstrom, Austin Eisenman, Captain Rosenberger, Bill Cramer, and "Red" Johnston were the other Lions who won their preliminary matches.

Lehigh followed close behind, with Meixell in the 118-pound class, Case in the 126-pound division, Bishop in the 155, Crockett in the 165, and Scobey, the Brown and White, heavyweight. Princeton, Ikonovise, had five; Snellham, 126; Bowie, 135; Hooker, 155; Elliott, 165; and Triede, 175.

Syracuse, Harvard have three.

Three Syracuse grapplers entered the semi-finals, Giglio winning in the 118-pound class, while Lavigne beat Stoddard, of Harvard. Captain Hordines beat Yoder, of Penn State, to qualify for the evening matches.

Farley, 145, Emery, 165, and Barrows in the heavyweight division, left Harvard still very much in the race. Lustbader, Columbia 118-pounder, and Ed King in the 175-pound class represented the New York Lions.

Lehigh Scores Four Falls

Yale had three men left in the competition—Hull, in the 155-pound class, Captain Haase in the 145-pound division, and Snowden, favored heavy-

weight. Penn failed to qualify a man.

Lehigh, however, led in team scoring at the close of the afternoon bouts, having scored four falls. Penn State, Princeton, and Cornell followed close behind with three each, while Columbia and Yale had two. Harvard had one point to complete the team scoring.

Cramer Pulls Upset

The biggest upset of the afternoon came when Bill Cramer, Lion 145-pounder, tossed Gregory, Princeton, last year's champion, in a little over five minutes. Captain Rosenberger also scored one of the quickest falls of the afternoon when he tossed Gordon, of Penn, in two minutes, fifty-two seconds.
