4 Visiting Scientists To Deliver Papers Before Club Organized by Sperry

Dr. Henry F. Hunt, director of laboratories at the Geisinger Hospital in Danville, will be one of the several speakers at the first meeting of the local branch of the Society of American Biologists here, April 21.

Other prominent biologists who will deliver papers are Dr. J. W. Rice, head of the bacteriology department at Bucknell University and C. A. Darling, head of the biology department at Allegheny College. H. J. Conn, chief director of research at the New York State College, may also speak.

Dr. Joel A. Sperry, professor of bacteriology, who will be in charge of the meeting, was responsible for establishing the local branch here last December, when he presented a petition to the society at its annual meeting in Philadelphia.
