A new regulation to permit certain freshmen in small colleges to participate in intercollegiate athletics was considered at the meeting of the Pennsylvania Intercollegiate Athletic Eligibility conference held in Harrisburg recently.

The new regulation would allow those freshmen who have attended the institution during the preceding two quarters of a semester to compete as members of varsity teams.

Freshmen in a number of small Pennsylvania colleges now play on their varsity football and basketball teams. The new regulation aims at eliminating this condition.
