**CINEMANIA**

Claude Rains, whose characterizations distinguished "The Invisible Man" and "Crime Without Passion," garners more laurels in "The Last Outpost," which plays at the Cathaum on Wednesday. Cary Grant and Gertrude Michael are the other leads.  
Cut from much the same pattern as "Bengal Lancer" as regards type of locale, dramatic action, with the romantic interest slightly subordinated, yet playing an important part in the friendship of two British officers, "The Last Outpost" retains all of the qualities that made "Lancer" a memorable photoplay, but with a completely different plot development.  
Rains, as a British secret service agent in the Mesopotamia region during the World War, brings to his role a sincerity and skillfulness which marks him as an actor with a definite screen personality in this, his third picture.

"High Gaucho," which comes to the Cathaum on Thursday, introduces to the screen John Carroll and Steffi Duna in a stirring drama of love on the pampas.  
"The Virginia Judge," film version of Walter C. Kelly's well-known stage character, which plays at the Cathaum on Friday, is a combination of comedy and unsophisticated romance, a simple story of small town life in the Tidewater country of Virginia.  
Kelly himself, in the title role, contributes an excellent characterization as the lovable Judge whose court room is the center of many bits of philosophical, but sarcastic, humor as he pronounces sentence on the many cases appearing before him.  
Members of the supporting cast are Marsha Hunt, Stepin Fetchit, and Johnny Downs. The show was directed by Edward Sedgwick.
