Drama Division Opens Current Plays Library

The dramatic division of the College is introducing a new lending library service of current plays after ten years of success in this field. A complete directing service is being offered in addition to an opportunity to rent costumes and electrical equipment at a nominal cost. Modern plays may be obtained at reduced royalties by this plan.

The directing service is available for straight dramatic productions or musical shows. It was tried out with musical shows for two years under the direction of J. Ewing Kennedy,

and in straight dramas last year under the direction of Frank S. Neubaum and David D. Mason, of the department of English composition, before being added permanently to the extension service program. Supervision of the entire service is under Prof. Arthur C. Cloetingh, of the division of dramatics.

The lending library of current plays was started by Professor Cloetingh, head of the division, for the use of former students, and is now being used extensively by school and local dramatic organizations in many parts of the state.

The library, containing nearly all the modern plays obtainable for production, is the only one of its kind open to amateur producers in the state. It may be the only one of its

kind in the country. Through the medium of the library, amateur producers may examine plays under consideration for production at the rental fee of five or ten cents per play before investing in copies needed for production. The fee barely covers postage. Plays selected are purchased directly from the publishers.

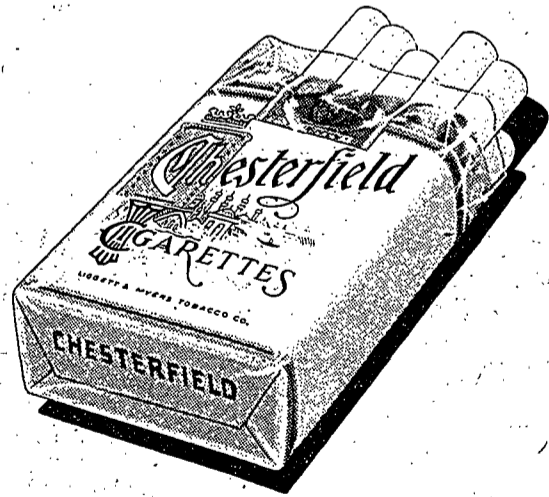
