al here inasmuch as it is in the power of the administration to do so.

2. To the Congress of the United States: that this body pass the Nye-Kvale bill as a step toward the complete abolition of R. O. T. C.

3. To the Congress of the United States: that this body enact gen-

ine, effective neutrality legislation to prevent entanglement of the United States in war—no loans, credits, munitions or secondary war materials to belligerents.

4. To the Legislature of the State of Pennsylvania: that the law passed restricting academic freedom by enforcing the oath of allegiance in schools and colleges be repealed.
