The Lion yearling football squad leaves the Corner this morning to invade the stronghold of the Pitt Panther frosh. The game will be played tomorrow on the Shadyside Academy Field at 2 o'clock. The traveling squad is composed of ends, McClintoch, Washabaugh, Radcliff, Alter and Baxter; tackles, Straviniski, Ted Nemeth, McCullough, Carter, Handler or Leslie; guards, Pollock, Schwartz, Thompson, Dave Nemeth, and Hamilton; centers, Love, and Lucas; backs, Rollins, Ewalt, Jekes, Valeri, Buchan, Toth Woolridge, DeFranco, and Silvestri. During practice this week, Coach McAndrews stressed a passing attack and defense. In passing against the Scranton-Keystone team the

freshmen threw five aeriels and completed not a single one. Running back punts was also stressed. In facing Pitt the frosh will be up against one of their strongest opponents. Last week the Panthers dropped a close one to Carnegie Tech's plebes, 7-to-0. Cassiano, left halfback of Pitt, was their outstanding performer. 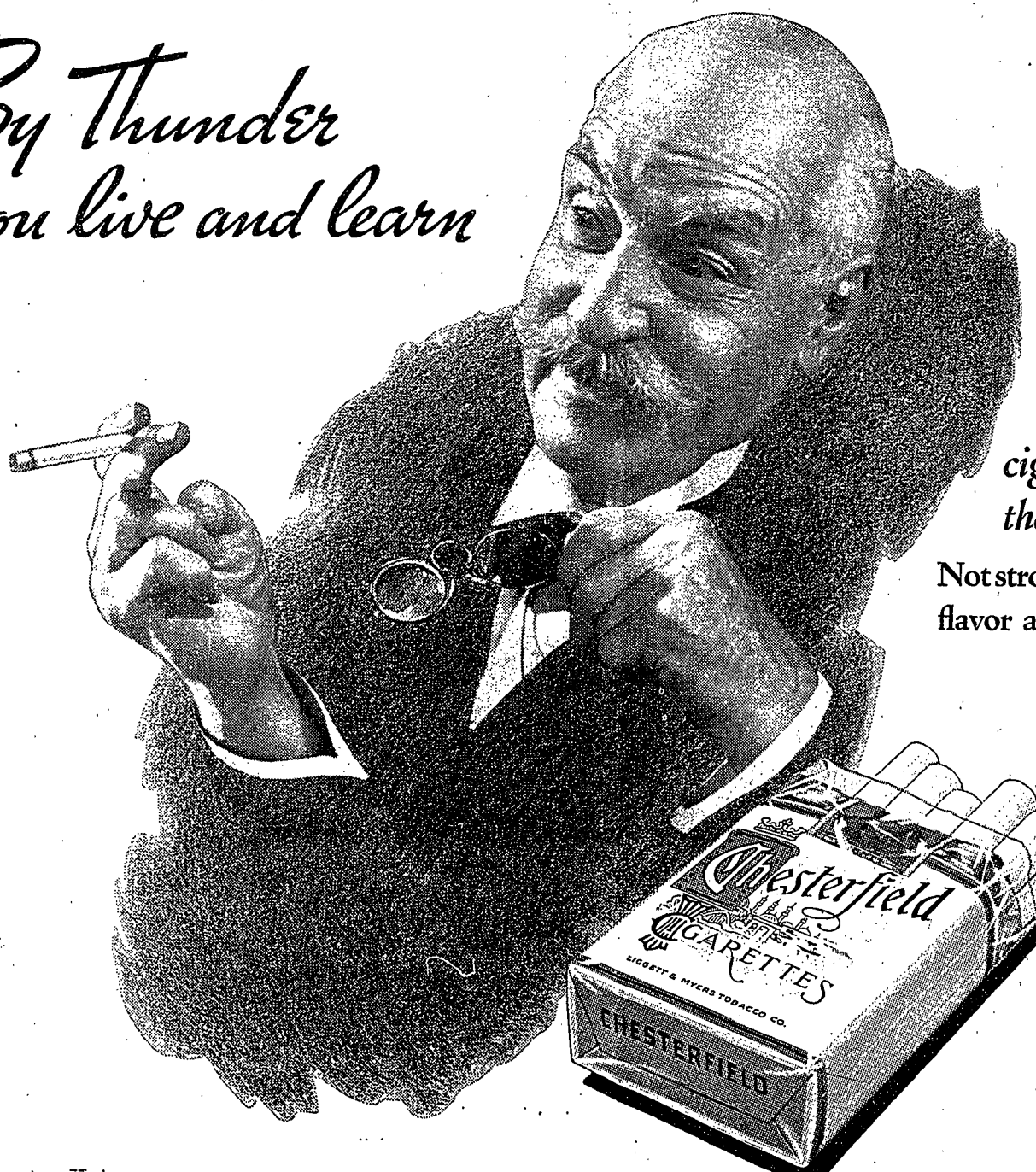
