#### Soccer Banquet Held

Members of Penn State's undefeated soccer team were entertained at a banquet at the State College Hotel Saturday night. Speakers included Coach Bill Jeffrey; Dr. Erwood C. Davis, of the School of Physical Education and Athletics; Charlie Speidel, wrestling coach; Jim Cherry, captain of the 1927 team; Captain Bill McMann. Captain-elect Sol Michoff; and Phil Barnes. Ray Conger, of the School of Physical Education and Athletics, showed movies of the 1932 Olympic games. Frank Osterlund acted as toastmaster.

#### Fencing

Ernest Van Haagen a transfer from Haverford College, is another outstanding candidate. Being ineligible to compete this year he is at present acting as coach to the freshmen.

A match pending with Lafayette may increase the number of matches for the season from four to five.

#### Skiing

At a recent meeting, the Penn State Ski Club elected Paul Massey to lead it through its second year's venture in State's new winter sport. As captain, Massey will act in an executive capacity in the club.

Al Grow and Lou Hall were elected to fill the offices of secretary and treasurer, respectively. These three men, all of whom helped gain prestige for State in skiing last winter, former the backbone of the squad from which Coach Max Dereum hopes to develop a championship combination.

A late start in actual practice was the result of a lack of snow cover. Coach Dereum has been conducting a dry course in fundamentals so that the time would not be wasted. The snow fall of a few days ago has made some skiing possible at the club's development on Bald Top Mountain.

A great interest has been shown in skiing. Thirty new names were present at the opening meeting. Membership is still open to all those who are interested. Members of the club receive an instruction book, are given practical instruction, and have free access to the club's facilities.
