Chance for 3-Time Winner

If Jack Light or Rudy Ashman, Lehigh 126-pounder, can win a title this year, the victor will be the first wrestler to win three Eastern intercollegiate titles since Russell of Yale won the 175-pound championship in 1925, '26, and '27.

In surveying the field it looks like the 118-pound battle centers around Stegmaier, Palmer of Princeton, and Kinney of Yale. Ashman is going strong towards his third bid for the 126 title. In the 135-pound class it looks like a finish between Zazzi and Perry of Princeton.

The 145-pounders make up a rugged class with Jack Light, Elmes of Columbia, and Becker of Syracuse. Dick Bishop has the edge in 155, although Jack Calvin and Powers of the Tigers will make strong bids. The 165-pound tussle centers around Emory of Princeton and Krupa. Ross Shaffer must overcome Gifford of Princeton at 175. The unlimited class puts up Joe O'Dowd, Toll of Princeton, and Glending of Harvard.


