State Courtmen Head Loop's Defensive Play

Penn State's cagers led the Eastern Conference in defensive play, according to figures compiled recently. Opponents of the Lions were able to average only twenty-eight points per game.

Sol Michoff, high scoring forward, sank more foul shots than any other player in the Conference. He scored a total of thirty, averaging three each game.

The team totals published in the last issue of the COLLEGIAN were incorrect. The Lions scored a total of eighty-three field goals, 102 foul shots, and 287 points in Conference games, and 103 field goals, fifty-six foul shots and 262 points in non-Conference competition. The team piled up a total of 549 points in seventeen tilts.

Herb Peterson had five field goals and two foul shots in Conference games and Maurice Parker scored three field goals and one foul shot in five non-league tilts, raising his total to twelve in nine games. Errors appeared in their records also.

N. I. C. A Elects Speidel President at Nationals

Coach Charles Speidel was elected president of the National Intercollegiate Wrestling Coaches Association at a meeting of the officials of the national wrestling tournament at the State Teachers College, Ind., on Saturday. In 1930 Coach Speidel was vice-president of the same organization.

Coach Speidel attended the national tourney which was won by Oklahoma A. & M. by the sizeable margin of thirty points, the nearest competitor was able to score only nine. Penn State is being considered as the site for the national tournament for next year according to reliable sources.

Chemical 'Who's Who' Lists 101 Graduates

The "Chemical Who's Who of 1937" lists the biographies of 101 Penn State graduates who have been outstanding in the field of chemistry.

This standard reference work contains sketches of 5,686 chemical company executives, chemists and chemical engineers, and professor at leading colleges and universities. These men hold degrees from 456 American and 49 foreign institutions.

At the head of the list of universities in the number of their graduates among the country's chemical leaders, stands Columbia with 349, Massachusetts Institute of Technology is second with 330, and Yale is third with 250. One hundred and twenty-eight colleges are represented by but a single graduate.

Phys. Ed. School Gets Torrance Cabin Lease

A lease for the cabin of Prof. Frank M. Torrance was signed on Saturday morning by Dr. Elwood C. Davis, of the School of Physical Education and Athletics. This cabin, along with several others not yet secured, will become part of the School's recreational program. These mountain spots are being secured for enjoyment by the students.

The lodge is located one mile from Pine Grove Mills, which can be reached by auto, and six miles from Shingletown Gap over easy hiking ground. A stream runs close by and the scenery around is as beautiful as any spot in the valley. The location of the cabin is given in the third revision of the hiking maps.
