### MacMillan Will Speak Here on Explorations

Commander Donald B. MacMillan, noted explorer and lecturer, will speak in Schwab auditorium Monday night at 8 o'clock under the sponsorship of the Christian Association. He will lecture on "Finding Records in

the Far North" and "My Life with the Polar Eskimo," to be augmented by movies and slides.

Commander MacMillan was graduated from Bowdoin College in 1898, where he did graduate work as well as at Harvard. He has carried on explorations in the great North Country for the last 28 years, and he is a life member of the National Geographic Society and a fellow in the Royal Geographic Society, London.

Four books and numerous magazine articles have been written by him, and in 1927 he was awarded the Eliza Kent Kane gold medal "for daring exploration and scientific research."

Tickets are priced at twenty-five and forty cents, entitling purchasers to reserved seats.

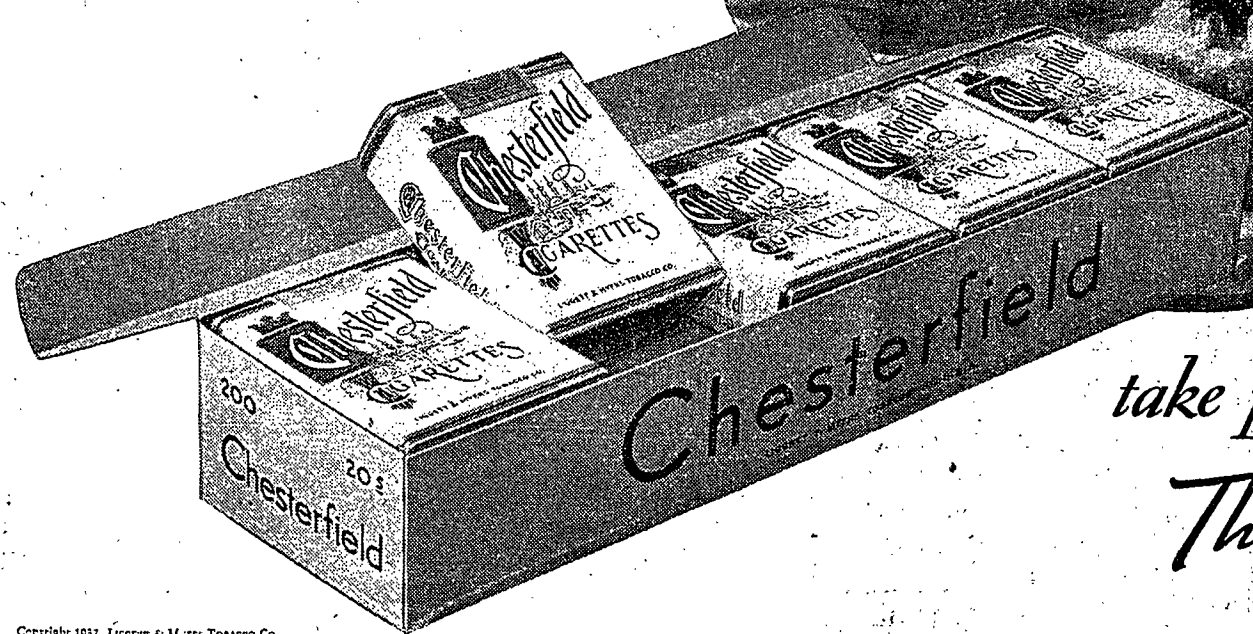
