12 Freshmen Get Comp Exemption

List, Subject To Revision, Is Lowest In Decade; Tests Same As Last Year

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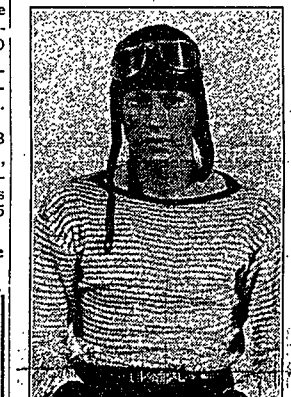
