guard for eight yards. But it was Marshall "Biggie" Goldberg and "Curley" Stebbins who juggernauted the Panthers' first march of 41 yards. Patrick lunged through guard for the first touchdown with Frank Souchak placekicking the extra point.

After Steve Rollins almost got away on the next kickoff, Don Hensley, Pitt's troublesome center, intercepted a State pass and started a 49-yard touchdown drive by Goldberg and Stebbins again. Goldberg scored this time and Souchak again converted.

Cassiano Races 79 Yards

Sutherland's second team came trotting on the field and soon after the start of the second quarter uncorked the most spectacular run of the afternoon. Harrison had just punted over the Pitt goal line and Stapulis hit guard for a yard.

Then Dick Cassiano, behind perfect interference, raced wide around his own right end, and once past the line of scrimmage there was no doubt as to where he was headed—79 yards for a touchdown. Merkovosky added the extra point with a placement.

Goldberg Scores Again

The rest of the half was about even, but the third quarter was State's until the starting eleven came back into the game. Then with Goldberg, Stebbins, and Patrick doing it again, the Panther made it 28 points. The great Biggie scored again this time and Patrick placekicked the conversion.

The Lions, weakened by the absence of Tackle Dean Hanley because of an injured knee, put forth a few offensive and defensive stars of their own. Dud Enders, Danny DeMarino, and Alex Barantovich were the Nittany linemen particularly outstanding on the defense.

Giannantonio Sparkles on Defense
Tony Giannantonio sparkled with his vicious tackling and was successful in snaring a Panther pass. Co-capt. Sammy Donato, for the time he was in the game, certainly made use of every one of his 155 pounds in really savagely tackling the big Pittsburghers.

Windy Wear and Steve Rollins ripped off some beautiful runs, and were almost in the clear a couple of times. Harry Harrison's punting and one kick-off that went five yards behind the goal line were noteworthy offensive maneuvers.

Nine Seniors Play

Nine of the eleven seniors on the squad played in their last college game. They were Joe Adessa, DeMarino, Donato, Co-capt. Johnny Economos, Enders, Frank Sills, Carl Waugaman, Wear, and Tim Wible.

Bob Higgins expressed almost everyone's opinion when he said, "The boys and I all enjoyed this season, and this kind of weather makes us glad that it is over."

With eleven juniors considered varsity men, Higgins has decided not to have a captain elected, but will appoint one before each game next year.
