

### Sixth All-College Hike Features Ice-Skating

This is the sixth all-college hike of the year and every student and faculty member who is interested in hiking is invited. Transportation will be provided from Rec hall at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon.

Everybody is urged to bring ice-skates for, if the weather permits, the afternoon can be spent in skating. For those who do not wish to skate, hikes into the surrounding mountains are being planned. A fee of 15 cents will be charged to cover the cost of refreshments and transportation.

"Dress warmly," said James. "Bring blankets if you wish, and the hike will be enjoyed by all." Last Sunday over 30 hikers climbed to the top of the ski trail on Bald Knob Mountain. This was an excellent turn-out considering the weather of that day.

### 50 Skiers Ready To Open Season

The Penn State Ski Club held its first meeting of the season last Tuesday in Room 410, Old Main, and over 50 enthusiastic skiers and potential skiers were present.

This year, skiing will be coached by Ben Harriman, a Dartmouth alumnus and a graduate student of chemistry here. Paul Massey '38 is the captain of the ski team which will represent Penn State in several meets this winter.

All club members turned out for the meeting in their ski clothes and brought their skiing equipment with them. Coach Harriman gave a talk on the proper care of equipment, emphasizing the applying of wax to skis.

The weather so far this year promises plenty of snow, and the skiers are hoping for the best. Several of the club members were practicing on the Centre Hills golf course early this week. About 17 of them were skiing on the base of the ski trail Monday afternoon. There has not been sufficient snow, as yet, to permit the full use of the trail.

The Ski Club is open to all students interested in the sport. Women are invited, for skiing is being taken up more and more by women, and almost every big meet permits their entering.

### Book Exchange Petition

(Following is the petition submitted by a committee of the Independent Party to the College Committee on Administration.)

The College Administration  
The Pennsylvania State College

We, the undersigned committee, acting under appointment by Joseph A. Peel, Junior Class President, do hereby petition for space on the college campus in which to operate a second hand book exchange. This exchange will operate on a non-profit basis and for the sole purpose of enabling students to get second-hand books at a reduced price.

It is our plan to have the student set his own price on the book he wishes to sell, said price not to exceed two-thirds the original value of the book, and leave it at the exchange which will make every effort to find a buyer. If the book is sold, the seller and the buyer each will pay a five-cent service charge. This five-cent service charge will go to cover the operating expenses of the exchange. If the book is not sold, there will be no charge made.

The exchange will operate for approximately two weeks, one week at the close of the first semester and one week at the beginning of the second semester.

This venture is being sponsored by the Independent party in fulfillment of one of its platform promises to the student body and because the student body in general feels that a means of savings on student text books should be provided.

As a possible location for this exchange we suggest one of the cloak rooms at the front entrance of the Old Main Sandwich Shop. We think this space will serve the purpose because it is centrally located and because it will not inconvenience the Sandwich Shop patrons since three cloak rooms are available for their use.

As a second possible location we suggest any vacant room on the third floor of Old Main.

We, the committee, agree to accept responsibility for any space granted us for this purpose.
