Mat Recruits Add Strength To Grapplers

The start of the new semester and the return of athletes from practice teaching have brought new grapplers to the wrestling mats where Prof. Charlie Speidel's students, who flunked last semester with a minus two, are shaking off the weight and rustiness of a week's lay-off. The failure of the Lion wrestlers to crack the winning column in their first two meets was overshadowed by the inability of Al Zazzi, king of the eastern 125-pounders, to return to championship form in the 145-pound class. Professor Speidel has scrambled the lineup in an effort to snap the squad out of its "flunking" habit. The Craighead twins, John and Frank, who jointly held a commanding hold on the 125-pound class, have finally been split. Frank will attempt to hold on to that weight division alone while brother John will move up a weight to grapple Reynolds for the 135-pound spot. Frank Sills, guard on the Lion grid squad, has joined Vic Gentilman, Steve Priolo, and Smith in the fight to represent State in the 155-pound class.

Frosh Cagers Easily Defeat Bisons 52-28

Penn State's eager Cubs tucked their second straight victory under their belts Saturday afternoon with a 52-28 win over Bucknell. Sparked by the scoring of Johnny Moffatt with 11 points and Norm Racusin with 10, the yearlings took the lead less than a minute after the start and remained in front until the final gun. At half-time, State led 24-14. Moffatt broke the scoring ice with a foul shot and Ed Sapp followed directly with a basket. Armor racked up Bucknell's first goal, and the score went to 3-2. State Takes 16-8 Lead. A barrage of six goals and one foul shot by State pushed the Cubs into a 16-8 lead as Bucknell netted two baskets and two penalty shots in the interim. Goals by: Crowell, substituting for Christman; and Racusin, and two by Moffatt gave State its 24 points at half-time; while Riley, Nolan, and Armor each whipped the cords for Bucknell to push the Bison mid-game tally to 14. Erratic playing by the Cubs made their victory unimpressive. They showed a practice-lapse staleness in both their shooting and team work. Bucknell's team was small, lacked precision shooting, and had difficulty penetrating the yearlings' zone defense. High scorer for the Bisons was Armor who racked up 10 points. Coach Nick Thiel sent his entire reserve squad into the second half of the fray. The Cubs tallied 14 goals, while Bucknell garnered four goals and six fouls to end the game, 52-28.
