## Albright Will Replace Nemo In R.O.T.C. Unit

Major J. J. Albright, now a student at the Command and General Staff School at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, has received orders to report next September to replace Major Nemo. Nemo will pursue a course of study at the Chemical Warfare Service School at Edgewood Arsenal, Maryland, after which he will report for duty at Los Angeles, California.

## Ebert States Traffic System Is Successful

In a report from G. W. Ebert, superintendent of grounds and buildings, the revised traffic system has proven successful.

With continued cooperation from students, faculty, and townspeople, Ebert believes that accidents and hazardous traffic conditions will be avoided. He pointed out that a great number of students with cars have never applied for Penn State licenses. Regulation State stop signs are to be installed at the intersection near the library and in front of the Agriculture building.
