In high school, Vukmanic hustled the javelin 206 feet 10 inches and picked up another two feet under the tutelage of Chuck Weiner in his freshman year. And when a sophomore, only two years under the guidance of Chuck, he tore off nine feet from the Penn Relay javelin record with a 223-foot, 10 1/2-inch heave

Regardless of the outcome of the N. A. A. U. meet next month, Vukmanic's name must be mentioned when naming an all-star track cast. The only odds against the Lion sophomore in that meet will be the burden of carrying around three crowns for the other boys to shoot at

With the steady improvement he has shown through his two years here, and with another two years of active collegiate competition, there seems no doubt but that the right arm of the 200-pound, 20-year old javelin ace will pitch him into the midst of the Olympic scramble and carry him out among the leaders.

Kauffer's Posters Will Open Summer Session Fine Art's Exhibitions

This year's Summer Session has been most fortunate in securing through the Division of Fine Arts, one of the most important exhibitions of the Museum of Modern Art, New York City. The display is a show of posters by E. McKnight Kauffer and will be on exhibition in room 303 Main Engineering building

Mr. Kauffer was an American by birth and education but for a quarter of a century has dominated English poster design. Among the most advanced artists in England, his posters reflect such movements as Vorticism, and Surrealism, but always assimilated and adapted for advertising purposes

The exhibition includes fifty posters, covering such a range of twenty years and advertising such various goods or services as telephones, art exhibitions, subways, gasoline, department stores, wines, steamship lines, museums, savings banks and the delights of travel. This is the second exhibition assembled by the Museum in order to bring to the attention of the American public the fact that posters need not be the tasteless, crowded and disorderly compositions which so often are seen in our subways, billboards, street cars, and railroads
