EVENINGS BY APPOINTMENT



H. H. WETZEL, AIR EXECUTIVE, DEAD

Harry H. Wetzel, husband of the former Maude Thomas of Howard, died at 3:30 o'clock yesterday morning in the Santa Monica Hospital, California, from general peritonitis which followed an emergency abdominal operation. Mr. Wetzel had been ill three weeks.

A graduate of Penn State in 1914, Mr. Wetzel rose to heights in the aviation industry and was vice-president and general manager of the Douglas Aircraft Corporation at the time of his death. During the World War, Mr. Wetzel was senior airplane inspector for the government at Los Angeles. In 1922 he joined Donald Douglas in a small aircraft firm, which today has become one of the world's largest.

Mr. Wetzel supervised the production of more than 175 models and 1900 individual planes—from drawing board to take-off. His hopes centered on the DC-4, world's largest plane. Recently, the ship successfully completed flight tests, and soon will be the latest in commercial air carriers.

Born in Pittman, Pa., he was 50 years old at the time of his death. He is survived by his wife, his mother at Tamaqua, Pa., and one son, Harry, Jr., a student at Cornell University, Ithaca, N. Y.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon from the Hollywood First Presbyterian Church with Dr. Stewart P. MacLennan officiating. Interment will be made in the Forest Lawn Cemetery, Glendale.

Mrs. Maude Thomas Wetzel is the daughter of the late Thomas and Clara Thomas of Howard. Her sister, Gertrude Naugle, resides in Manheim, Pa., and her brother, Penn, graduate of the College in '09, makes his home in New York City. Another brother, Weber, lives in Santa Monica.

Mrs. Wetzel's mother was a sister of the late Abraham Weber of Howard, father of Balse Weber, county commissioner. The late John Weber, William Weber, and Mrs. Mary Muffley, all of whom resided in Howard, were uncles and aunts of Mrs. Wetzel. Members of the four families still reside in Howard.

Vukmanic Wins NAAU Javalin Toss

Nick Vukmanic, State's fast stepping sophomore javelin-thrower, made it four out of four Sunday when he captured the spear-tossing event in the National Amateur Athletic Union annual track and field championships at Buffalo, N. Y., with a heave of 218 feet, 7½ inches.

The victory marked Vukmanic as the country's outstanding javelin-thrower for the current season.

Chick Werner, Lion track mentor, entered his second-year ace in four major championship tournaments this year and watched him walk away with all four titles besides shattering the Penn Relays record by more than nine feet. The toss in the Relays was also his best, 221 feet, 10½ inches. The other titles won were the IC-4A and National Collegiate Athletic Association championships.

Vukmanic's toss in the NAAU bettered Lowell Todd's try by a little less than three feet. It was the second time the Lion nosed out the San Jose College athlete this year, the first occurring in the NCAA meet Larry Bell, American record holder with 231 feet, placed fourth with a throw of 194 feet, 2½ inches.

First and second place winners in the NAAU tourney were invited to tour Europe in a series of barn storming track meets. Vukmanic, however, will not go along, preferring to remain at his home in Mather.

Billy Smith, freshman two mile speedster and winner of the freshman cross country IC-4A championship last fall, romped home second in the Jun-10,000 meter run after J. Errol Vaughn of the New York Athletic Club.

Register Monday For Net Tourney

The tournament will consist of three sets and the winner must win two of the three.
