J. A. Taylor Advanced To Professorial Position

The board of trustees has approved 21 appointments to the College's faculty, Pres Ralph D. Hetzel said today One staff member, James A Taylor, research assistant in fuel technology was advanced to the rank of professor

Two of the appointees, W T S Thorp, animal pathology research, and Miss Ivalclare S Howland, body mechanics, are assistant professors

Six of the appointees will come here as instructors They are: C A Anderson, industrial engineering, W E Diefendel, mechanical engineering, Paul I Miller, history, R S Griewe, physical education and athletics, Eugene Wetstone, gymnastics and Frances M Manges, history and political science

Research Assistants R B Healy, A H Mazzatola, and N D Lawson, petroleum research, R D Hinkel and R H McCormick, petroleum refining, and Catherine Logan and Anne T O'Brien, home economics research, were appointed to the ranks of research assistants
