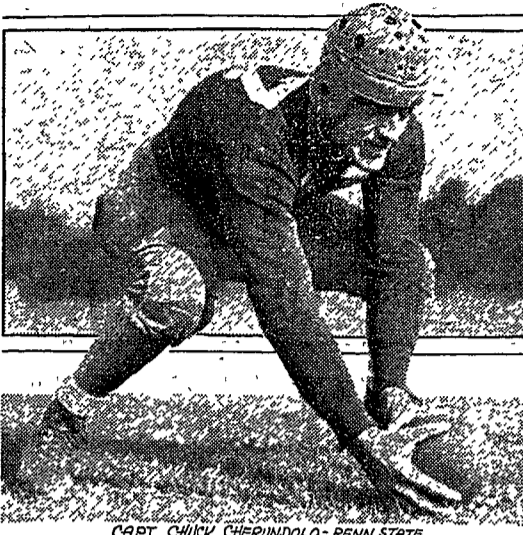

Application To Patrol Must Be Signed By Parents; Card, Plate Given

Students will be allowed to own and operate automobiles on the campus again this year, according to Captain William V. Dennis of the campus patrol.

A permit, as usual, will be required. Application for the permit is made to the patrol office on the third floor of Old Main.

25 Cent Fee Levied, 21 and graduate.

All students — undergraduates, special, and graduate — must have their application signed by their parents or guardians unless the applicant is 21 years of age or over.

The acceptance of the permit will entitle the student to a license plate and a card for which there is a charge of 25 cents.

Violations of campus driving or parking regulations may result in the loss of the permit. Captain Dennis warned.

Tops All Spear Tossers

Vukmanic Cops 4 Titles In Year To Top Javelin Men

One of the nation's outstanding track greats, Nick Vukmanic, State's sensational sophomore javelin thrower, put another title under his belt when he captured the spear-tossing event in the National Amateur Athletic Union annual track and field championships at Buffalo on July 1.

The title was Vukmanic's fourth. Nick began his climb into the track spotlight at the Penn Relays in April when he shattered the carnival's four year record by over nine feet with a heave of 223 feet, 10 1/2 inches.

He also became the first Lion since 1927 to win an individual title at the Relays.

Four Titles In Year

Few track men have ever accomplished what Vukmanic has accomplished—won four major titles in one season.

Student Union Office Is Campus Hub

The hub of all the extra-curricular activities at Penn State—that's the Student Union.

Endeavoring to serve as a coordinating agency for all activities on the campus, the Union has proven itself to be an invaluable student organization since its inception in 1930.

Performing its work through the media of recommendation to its component groups, the Student Union is not supervisory and has no legislative power. Representatives from each of the major activities comprise the membership of the Union Board, although every student engaging in activities is automatically a member.

Also included in its membership are the Dean of Men, the Dean of Women, the Student Union manager, and two members of the administration and faculty elected for terms of two years. The first three are ex officio members.

Handles Many Projects
In its eight-year history, the Union has undertaken and completed many projects which could not be properly handled by individual groups.

No Grid Captain

Penn State's football team will have no permanent captain this year. A captain will be named, instead, before each game.

A regular sponsor of all College dances, the organization also holds a number of concerts of popular and classical records.

General services, such as the handling of the ping pong and billiard equipment and the Carnegie Foundation phonograph records, are extended through the information bureau situated on the first floor of Old Main.

The office is open every day except Sunday from 8 o'clock in the morning until 7 at night. It is open Sunday morning and afternoon.

Within the past few years the office has taken over the handling of the funds for the three principal campus publications, the Collegian, Froth and Bell.
