

Freshmen To Observe Customs Tomorrow

Tribunal Promises Rigid Enforcement; To Meet Tonight For Exemption

Kings for a week, approximately 1,500 freshmen will descend meekly from their haughty thrones at 1:10 o'clock tomorrow afternoon as the men's Student Tribunal and the women's Judiciary Committee move into control.

Sounding the general warning to freshmen last night was a statement released by Student Tribunal, indicating that customs would be enforced as rigidly as they were last year.

Said the statement, "Last year, customs were rigidly enforced, and this year's Tribunal hopes to continue that good work. Freshmen are warned beforehand that all customs will be very rigidly enforced."

Meanwhile, the first meeting of the Tribunal will be held tonight at 7:30 o'clock in Room 305, Old Main, when freshmen desiring to gain exemptions will be permitted to present their case.

Members of the Tribunal are: Bernard A. Biggs, Herbert B. Cahlan, Joseph F. Cohan, Victor E. Gentilman and George W. Yeckley, all seniors.

Among other things, freshmen must wear blue-and-white dinks and black four-in-hand ties, carry matches and a copy of the Student Handbook and shy away from the campus glass.

Women will don long green ribbons and large name cards.

they must turn in preference cards on Saturday, between 7 p m and 10 p m, in order to be pledged. Failure to do so suspends pledging for 30 days.

A silent period will be observed from 7 a m Sunday. There will be a thorough check-up on the observance of the code throughout the remainder of the rushing season.

Signed bids must be returned to Student Union by 11 p m Sunday.

From today on, fraternity men may accompany freshmen to

their houses and contact them in eating establishments.

"Since this year marks a turning point in men's rushing at Penn State, naturally numerous flaws and loopholes will be found in the revised code," Coskey commented.

Changes Needed

"This will mean more change in next year's code," the I F Council head pointed out. "So far I have noticed that the informal contact periods have been taken advantage of by certain fraternities who have monopolized rushing operations to an extent that is unfair to the other houses."

"The informal and open house periods just passed through have been reasonably successful," Coskey also said. "From now on the code will be similar to last year's code."

I realize that there are certain loop holes in the present code but the only thing that I can do from now until the close of rushing season is to see that the code operates as smoothly and as fairly for all as possible."
