 to overestimate some of the items in order to offset the loss on others which might be underestimated.

Although the whole thing seems to be above board, it is feared that the public—unfamiliar as it is with the contracting business—will be wont to disregard the explanation.

This, it is said, has put Ickes on the spot, for he fears that a minor flaw may be so magnified for political expediency that it would give one of the New Deal's biggest financial organs a black eye before the public, especially so in a state where the mercury in the political thermometer is bursting through the top.

Thus, with Ickes determined to move slowly and pay close attention to the charges involving the Authority's gigantic program, indications were that hopes for an immediate okay from the PWA on the contemplated \$1,000,000 grant to the College have been dealt a setback.
