TO BE OR NOT TO BE

WORE THAN seven months ago, during the ceremonies marking the formal opening of the five-million-dollar building program here, Governor George H Earle proposed that the name of the Pennsylvania State College be changed to "The University of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania"-first, because he thought the institu tion was in fact a university, second, because Pennsylvania technically is a "commonwealth"

Following the Governor's subsequent request the Collegian conducted a campus-wide survey of student opinion and found that of the 3,695 students contacted, only 79—less than two per cent—showed disapproval of the change

Of those who did prefer the change to university ranking, however, 3,492 proposed a name of their own choosing, a name which they thought would answer the need for a change in status yet retain the traditionally sacred words "Penn State" They suggested "Pennsylvania State University"

Soon afterward College President Ralph D Hetzel personally presented the results of the poll to the Governor, who prompty acknowledged the report and ordered Charles J Margiotti, then attorney-general, to study the matter and present

Accordingly, about a fortnight or so later, Mr. Manglotti ruled in a formal opinion that because the College is subject to the provisions of the Non-Profit Corporation Act inso tar as the amending of its charter—and hence its name—is concerned, it would have to follow low a lengthy procedure requiring seven dis tinct steps and consummating at least four or

-A resolution authorizing the proposed amendment to be adopted by a majority of the Board of Trustees at a regular of special meeting "convened after at least ten days' written notice to all memhers of this purpose'

2-The proposed name must be registered with the Department of State

3-The article of amendment, together with a certificate from the Department of State showing the registration of the proposed name, must be nled in the office of the Centre County Prothono-

4-After advertisement, application must be made to the Centre County Court of Common

Pleas for approval
5--If the court is satisfied as to the propriety of the amendment, it directs the Piothonotary, to manemit the amendment to the Superintendent of Public Instruction

6-Within 60 days after receipt of the miticles cit of Education to consider the amendment

7-If the Council approves the amendment, "the Court may consent" to it and the new name must he recorded in the office of the Recorder of Centre County, whereupon it must be returned to the Frothonotary and filed in his office

Meanwhile, the Court may order hearings "fothe purpose of determining objection to the proposed change of name"

NATURALLY, with so much red tape to go through it was only logical that the College should bide its time and wait for the State Legislature to convene in an effort to have the name changed by open, yet less drawn-out legislative action least, such seemed to be the policy

Yet the Legislature has been in session during the past few months and not a word has been heard about changing the name of the College

It is under these conditions that the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees meets, here

NOW THE Collegian does not know exactly how far the Board has gone in seeking to change name The Collegian believes, however, that the Board is just as anxious to change the name as are the students, the faculty, the alumni and the Governor

It is for this reason, therefore, that the Collegian sincerely hopes the Executive Committee will find some time to discuss and to act on the name change

If the Board of Trustees, has not yet approved the name change, then the Collegian hopes that the Executive Committee will see fit to notify all members at once and call a special meeting for that purpose

If the Board of Trustees already has approved the name change, then the Collegian hopes that the Executive Committee will see fit to register the proposal with the Department of State immediately in an effort to speed up the process and have the name changed before June Commence-

Above all else, let's keep in mind that the Legislature is leady to adjourn at any moment and will not re-assemble until January, with propects of changing the name by legislative action no brighter than ever.

And at the same time let's keep in mind that the Centre County Court of Common Pleas con-venes Monday morning, December 12, with pros-pects of changing the name by next April or May Just as bright as ever.
