Frosh Gridmen Tackle Pitt In Morning Game

A strong but untried freshman grid squad will meet the Pitt Panther yearlings tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock on New Beaver Field. Slated as the toughest game on their schedule the frosh will encounter such Panther Cubs as Bill Goldberg, younger brother of Marshall Goldberg, All-American Pitt varsity back, and Edgar Jones, highly touted halfback from up in the anthracite county.

Lions Have Weight Edge
Pitt has a squad of 37 frosh to draw from compared to the Nittany yearling squad of over 40. A slight advantage in weight lies with the Lion squad.

Probable starters in the Pitt line up are Stan Gervelis and John Gigg at end, Bob Stegell and Bill Benghauser at tackle, Melvin Andrews and Ralph Fife at guard, George Allhouse or Al Kunkel at center, and Bill Goldberg, Edgar Jones, Bill Dutton, and Joe Connel in the backfield.

The Nittany frosh tomorrow will face an 11-year jinx created by the Panther cubs, as they have failed to win a game from the Panthers during that period.

Numbers will be given to the squad today with the starting line-up not scheduled to be announced until the time of the game.
