Booters Ready For 3 'Suicide' Contests

Bill Jeffrey's undefeated booters leave this morning for Syracuse to open the most crucial week of competition in Lion history as they meet three of the strongest soccer squads in the East.

Whether or not the Jeffreyemen come through a sixth consecutive undefeated season depends largely on the three teams in the 'suicide' series—Syracuse, Army, and Brown.

The Orangemen will be met Saturday After Syracuse, the Lions invade West Point, N. Y., on Wednesday, and Brown, Providence, R. I., Thursday.

State's soccermen, who have annexed an amazing string of thirty-five victories since 1932, have been tied but four times since then. Two of the teams which succeeded in accomplishing the feat are Army, 4-4, and Army last season, 0-0.

The last team to defeat the Lions was Syracuse in 1936, 2-1. There'll be revenge in the air.

Sixteen players will embark for Syracuse this morning. They are Zen Leskaias, Dick Hang, gonies, Bob Schuler, George Merwin and Dutch Lange or Red Watts, full-backs, Sam Davies, Buck Painter, Freddie Spylke and Jim Ickes or Dave Meyers, halfbacks, Van Hartman, Bob Ernst, Finny Mcgarr, Walt Hosterman, Gus Bigott, Bill Miller, and Woody Wodeck or Jack Pfeiffer, linemen.

The Orangemen thus far this season have defeated Hamilton, 4-0, lost to Army, 1-0, tied Bucknell and Lehigh, 2-2. Coach Harlocks is optimistic but admits that "Penn State has the best soccer team in the country."

Vanley, at goal for the Orange men, Toole and Lannon halfbacks are expected to provide the Lions with sturdy resistance. Thompson, one of the outstanding wingmen of the East, will hold down outside left for Syracuse.
