

Captain Chick Werner's varsity harriers will have a tough assignment before them tomorrow afternoon when they meet a powerful sextet of runners from Syracuse University on the local course during the half at the football game.

Bill Smith, sophomore who has paced the Lion's to victories over Manhattan and Lehigh already this season and has never lost a country race since entering Penn State, will be meeting two very good runners in Jesse Cavlier and Charley Southard, Orange hill-and-dalers, who, with Steve Romanowski, finished in a three-way tie for first at Syracuse last year.

There is some doubt as to whether or not Ray Trail, freshman Mohawk Indian distance sensation (until he was twice defeated by Smith last year) will run with the Orangemen. Neither he nor Romanowski competed at Syracuse defeated Colgate by a pair of scores, 15-40, two weeks ago.
