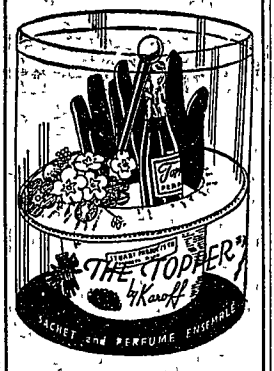
Working what is equivalent to nine rounds each day, the bidders shadow-box three rounds, punch the bag three more, and do stomach exercises for the remaining three.

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Taking first place in all events, the independent combination took the meet by a 39-13 score, big Dave Collier setting the pace with two individual victories and a fast last lap that decided the final relay event.

The closest competition, of the meet was in the diving, with the Dolphins' Dave Lynch winning with 40.78 points, trailed closely by big Vaughn Evans, DU's frosh

diving star, with 37.82. Clarence Short took third for the Dolphins with 25.9. Al Tapman, DU, trailing a little behind with 25.74.

Lynch piled up most of his points with a well executed twisting back one-and-a-half as his third optional dive.

H Page Schaefer '40, IM swimming manager, took charge of the meet and announced the events and results. Varsity Coach Robert E. Galbraith acted as referee, with Dean Carl P. Schott honorary referee.
