State Holds 16-8 Margin At Halftime

The basketball defiance that Syracuse University had rooted at Penn State turned into a mere breeze Wednesday night when Lawther's lanky Lions drove to a 33-19 loushshod victory over the vaunted Orangemen for their third straight win in as many starts.

State's supremacy was asserted in a defensive attack that could be considered well-nigh impenetrable—at least from the Syracuse standpoint. The fast, rough-

Alet offensive play, plus cool, careful and deliberate ball-handling, gave the Nittanymen a substantial 16-8 lead at half time. Cliff McWilliams, burly forward who went scoreless against Susquehanna last week, rattled four field goals and a foul into the netting to top the Lion-scoring Max Corbin was second with three double-deckers and a pair of fouls for eight points.

Sophomore Johnny Bair, a consistent performer in State's first two encounters, performed like a veteran against the Orange Bar, whose brilliant defensive work was a big factor in thwarting the sharpshooting Syracuseans, played the whole game along with Charley Prosser and Max Corbin.
