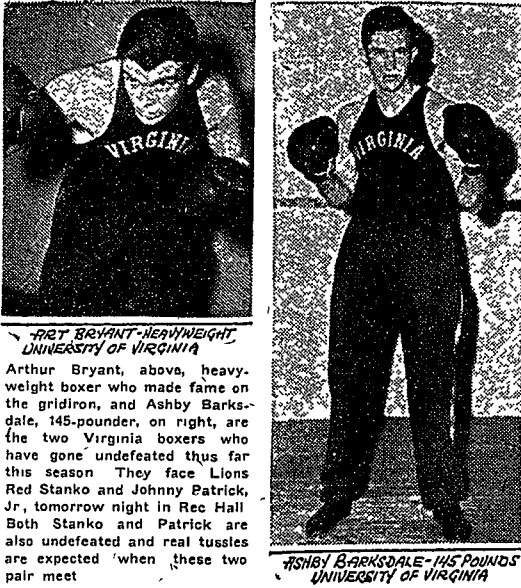

Panther freestyle sprinter No. 10, who has been clocked in 21 1/2 seconds for the 50-yard dash will meet determined opposition in State's Bill Kirkpatrick and Tom Allison. Pitt's Milton Ledwith, one of the fastest 440-yard freestyle men in the East, will battle against Ken Bunk. Guy McLaughlin will team with Bob Hildebrand in the dive. Pitt enters Brown and Ames' Bill Bogatin, Lion who just became eligible this semester will get his chance in one of the freestyle events. Pitt's medley relay team has registered a 4:13 time for the 300 yards. This is considerably better than the best time marked up by the Nittany relay outfit, 3:16 against Carnegie Tech. Captain Chuck Welsh and Lion teammates Mark Vincent, Al Bolleau, Bill Reilly, and others will have to do better than their best in order to keep their win streak intact. The freshman team will be about the same, as that which lost a close one to Mercersburg Academy earlier in the season.
