

Students Show Gains In Weight, Height Here

The average height and weight of the Penn State student is increasing rapidly according to a survey recently completed by Dr. C. D. Dietrich, assistant college physician.

The average height for boys last year was found to be 68.48 inches, while this year it increased to 70.95 inches. The average weight last year was 144.19 pounds, compared to 144.73 pounds this year.
Through an extensive survey conducted by doctors and anthropologists at Harvard University and at the University of Cincinnati several years ago, it was revealed that the average height of the American college student is increasing at the rate of one inch every 32 years. This sharply contrasts the rate here, where the increase this year over last year's average was 2.47 inches, or 79.04 inches in 32 years if the rate remained constant.
The average weight of the Penn State co-ed is 122.38 pounds, while her average height is 62.80 inches.
The tallest freshman boy at Penn State is 75.50 inches high; the shortest, 61.75. The heaviest freshman weighs 290 pounds; the lightest, 99 pounds. It is interesting to note that 81 of the boys of the class of 1942 are above six feet tall. The tallest student at the college is 78 inches high.
The youngest freshman here is 15 years of age, while the oldest is 30.

Bill Lederstein, Pitt's 220- and 440-yard Eastern Collegiate freestyle champion, raced through the 100-yard event in 5:21.1, bettering the former standard of 5:25. Pitt's 100-yard freestyle relay team closed the meet and record-breaking as they were clocked in 4:48.1. The Lion relay outfit finished in second place with a 4:50 - also bettering the old mark of 5:53.
The meet was not as one-sided as the score would seem to indicate for Coach Galbraith's swimmers pushed the Panthers in almost every event but found that they did not have quite enough stuff to outwim Pittsburgh's aggregation of Eastern Collegiate champions.
In the 50, 100, 220 and 440-yard freestyle events the Lions took both second and third places. It was in the breast and backstroke events that they were completely outclassed.
Lions Bill Kikpatrick and Bob Allison raced neck and neck with Pitt's Co-captain Valt Nowotny, 1937 Eastern Collegiate champ, in the 50 and were just nosed out by a touch at the finish.
In the 100-yard freestyle, Captain Welsh and Kikpatrick tied for second after keeping up with Nowotny for three laps and finally losing by a yard. Lions Ken Bunk and Tom Robinson placed second and third respectively in both the 220- and 440-yard events.
State's frosh took first and second in both the diving and the 100-yard backstroke events. Dave Lynch, runner-up for state scholastic diving championship last year, copped his event as teammate Ralph Erwin was second.
Backstroke Elmer Webb took first in the backstroke as Lion Jack Pruchter came through with a second place.
