To Keep Aloof From Politics, Smith States

Previous Political Venture Six Years Ago Nearly Cost Life of Club

Insisting that the Penn State Club was primarily a social organization and that it must remain aloof from political implications, Pres Robert L. Smith '39 explained the Club's "hands off" decision concerning the college-wide independent organizations drive.

An article in the Penn State Clubber, official news organ of the Club, pointed out that "dabbling in campus politics nearly cost the life of the Club six years ago."

To Follow Example

To this historic example was attributed the Club's current decision to quit the proposed drive for social and political unity among Penn State's non-fraternity men. General Club opinion favored the action, the article said.

Meanwhile, plans for the 100-to-door survey to be sponsored by the three independent political clubs were well underway, according to William W. Galbreath '39, spearhead of the drive.

Actual survey operations were expected to begin sometime this week. Each non-fraternity man will be asked to fill out a questionnaire.

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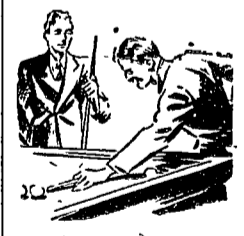
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
