Usilton died of a heart-attack at his home in Philadelphia early last Monday. He was 42 years old.

A week ago last Wednesday, State closed its court season with a 32-25 victory over Temple. It was the first time in Eastern Conference history that a Lion five had beaten an Usilton-coached quintet.

Usilton completed his 13th year as coach of the Owls last Friday. His last year's team won the Eastern Conference championship and was unofficial national titlist.
