To Give Oath To All-College President; Board Draws Up Freshmen Rules

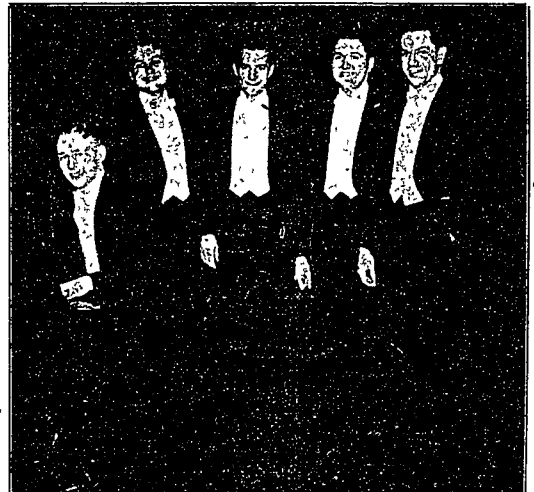

Subsidy Cut Threatened By New Bill

Franchise Tax Case May Cause State Fund Slicing

Special to the Collegian HARRISBURG, May 11—A slash in the biennial maintenance appropriation to the Pennsylvania State College even below the \$4,425,000 allocated by Governor Arthur H. James in his budget message last February loomed as a definite possibility here today.

The threat of curtailment of funds arose when Rep. Robert E. Woodside (R., Dauphin), the GOP floor leader, introduced a measure authorizing the Governor to abate all subsidies to state-owned hospitals, homes, colleges, universities, and counties on a pro-rata basis in the event the Supreme Court upholds the Dauphin County Court in its invalidation of the out-of-state corporation franchise law.

High state officials tried to minimize the importance of the bill, insisting that the cut in appropriations would be spread over approximately \$22,500,000 and that slashes to individual institutions would be comparatively small.

However, the bill, backed openly by the Governor, marks the first definite pronouncement of the administration's attitude toward economy in educational subsidies, making it practically a foregone conclusion that the Pennsylvania State College will not receive a cent above the allocated \$4,425,000, regardless of any legislative action to increase this.
