HARRISBURG, May 18—A maintenance appropriation of \$4,500,000—approximately \$75,000 above that allocated by Governor Arthur H. James in his budget message last February—is slated for the Pennsylvania State College for the 1939-41 biennium in the general appropriation bill now awaiting final vote.
