Noted Bass-Baritone Will Open Series of Schwab Programs

Herman Ivarson, Norwegian bass-baritone, will appear in the first of Schwab Auditorium Summer Session entertainments when he presents a concert at 8 p m Thursday.

Ivarson, a true exponent of Scandinavian music, has gained fame for the fire and vigor which he has brought to the songs of Sweden, Norway, Denmark and Finland.

The Scandinavian sections of Ivarson's program will not include all folk songs, but also world-known classics. He is especially adapted to the interpretation of ballads and interpretive songs in English. The American songs on his programs are up-to-the-minute in selection.

Ivarson's voice is rich, beautiful and sympathetic—all enhanced by a pleasing platform personality.

He has been featured on various radio networks including numerous world-wide broadcasts.

Ivarson has made four coast-to-coast tours in the past few years.

Session First Attracted 147 In 1910

50 Subjects First Offered; Now Over 500

Thirty summers ago 147 students attended the first Summer Session when only 50 subjects were offered. Today more than 3,000 will register to take approximately 500 subjects.

Designed at the beginning to aid teachers in Pennsylvania schools to obtain certificates in additional subjects, the Summer Sessions have grown to the point where they now attract, in addition, undergraduate students who wish to obtain extra credits by summer study, and graduate students working on advanced programs leading to the masters' and doctors' degrees.

Originally, only one session was offered. Eight years ago the summer program expanded and Inter-Session began. This three-week period opens shortly after Commencement week-end.

In 1932 still a third was added—the Post-Session. It begins after the Main Session and continues until the end of August.

Thus the present summer program—30 years old—now includes three separate sessions. The original Main Session is the longest as it involves six weeks.

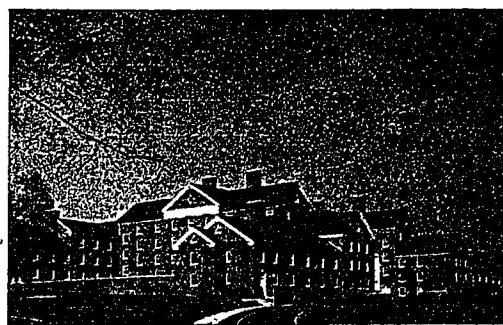
Enrollment Soars In Inter-Session

Enrollment figures for the past Inter-Session established a record for recent years for the College with 572 students attending. The increase was 27 percent greater than in 1938, according to Dr. Marion R. Trabue, dean of the School of Education and director of Summer Sessions.

Such an increase was probably due to the additional dormitory facilities on the campus, Dean Trabue pointed out. All campus dormitories were available and will also be used during main session.

Approximately 80 percent of the students at Inter-Session were candidates for degrees with more than 50 percent seeking advanced degrees.

Nature Course Will Be Continued

In an effort to meet an urgent need for outdoor training and experience under expert field naturalists and to satisfy the demands of teachers and nature lovers for practical nature study and science field work carrying college credit, the Summer Session Nature Camp, under the direction of the Department of Nature Education, will be continued this year.

Founded in 1923, the aim of the Camp is to familiarize students with the local trees, flowers, ferns, insects, birds, and mammals. It will be located in Stone Valley in the famous Tussey or Seven Sisters Mountains, 16 miles from here.

The region, only two miles from the Broad Mountain Game Refuge, abounds in game animals. A variety of interesting nature trails are laid out and marked about the Camp.
