Week's Freedom Ends
Student Handbooks will be stuffed into pockets along with matches—but the freshmen's handy shall not be kept in his pockets—as a week's reign of freedom comes to an end and the boys are subjected to the will of the omnipotent Student Tribunal.

Until the zero hour comes, freshmen will be permitted to roam the campus freely. But when Wednesday noon rolls around, the class of 1943 can forget all about co-eds, forget about smoking on campus, forget about walking on the grass or entering Old Main by any entrance other than the front.

A Message From Dean Warnock

To Penn State '43

All you'll be asked to do is to take each step when it should be taken, and to keep on stepping until the journey is ended.

Therefore, begin on your first day to do the journey step by step, and don't let yourselves fall step behind.

- 1—Freshmen shall at all times carry on their person a copy of the Student Handbook, known as the "Freshman Bible". The information requested on the Identification Page must be filled out.
- 2—Freshmen must at all times wear their dinks and plain black four-in-hand ties except on trips, holidays, when escorting women to house parties, house dances, or all-College dances. The period between midnight Saturday and 8:00 a.m. Monday shall be regarded as a holiday concerning only the dress customs, i.e. the dink and black tie. The dink is to be worn at all indoor athletic contests and mass meetings.
- 3—Freshmen shall not associate with co-eds within a three-mile limit of Old Main until after Thanksgiving vacation.
- 4—Freshmen shall attend all class meetings, athletic contests, and mass meetings and shall not leave such affairs until they are closed by the proper authorities or a reasonable excuse is offered, issued by Student Tribunal.
- 5—Freshmen shall carry matches at all times.
- 6—Freshmen shall at no time walk on the grass of the campus, or over unpaved short cuts but shall walk on the sidewalks. Freshmen shall not be permitted to walk on "Senior Walk" which extends from the main gate to the Pugh Street gate on the north side of College Avenue.
- 7—At football games, Freshmen shall occupy the east stands only.
- 8—Every Freshman shall wear during the first month of the College year a regulation badge upon which his name and home town is legibly printed in large black letters.
- 9—No immunities may be granted Freshmen by upperclassmen.
- 10—Freshmen are not permitted to smoke on the campus.
- 11—Freshmen shall remove their dinks upon entering Old Main.
- 12—At the command, "Button Frosh" Freshmen shall lift their dinks from their heads by the button much in the manner of tipping their hats.
- 13—Freshmen shall learn all the college songs appearing in the Handbook.
- 14—Freshmen must at all times keep their hands out of their pockets.
- 15—Freshmen must at all times enter and leave Old Main by the front entrance.

Chem Deposit Plan Retained

'Punch-Card' System Will Be In Effect Again

A revised system of collecting deposits to insure against breakage of College instruments by students enrolled in chemistry courses, instituted here last year, will be effective again this semester.

At the beginning of the semester, students who have scheduled chemistry courses, requiring breakage deposits, will be required to go to the Bureau's office with their schedule cards, and deposit the necessary amount of money.

To Get "Punch Cards"

In return they will receive a regulation "punch card" which will admit them to the course.

As the student receives his equipment the professor in charge will punch the indicated block on the card.

At the end of the semester a thorough checkup of the student's locker will be made and an immediate refund will be available at the Bureau's office.

from being occupied this semester. Use Retirement Funds.

The G. S. A. expects to borrow the \$6,000,000 from the state and school employees' retirement funds. It was these funds which financed the bulk of the \$55,000,000 G. S. A. construction program initiated under the administration of former Gov. George H. Earle.

It has not yet been ascertained what part of the new bond issue will be allotted to this College but present indications point to a favorable allocation.

Property and Supplies Secretary Roger W. Rowland said the bonds "will undoubtedly" be issued this month pending legal opinion and the purchase of equipment started immediately.

At the present time, there are 10,000 persons in the U. S. working toward Ph. D. degrees.

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
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
