on trips, holidays, when escorting women to house parties, house dances, or all-College dances. The period between midnight Saturday and 8 00 a m Monday shall be regarde as a holiday concerning only the dress customs, i e the dink and black tie The dink is to be worn at all indoor athletic

contests and mass meetings Freshmen shall not associate with co eds within a three-mile limit of Old Main until after Thanksgiving vacation

Freshmen shall attend all class meetings, athletic contests, and mass meetings and shall not leave such affairs until they are closed by the proper authorities or a reasonable ex-cuse is offered, issued by Stu-dent Tribuol dent Tribuna!
