

Hotel Training Course Lauded

Cite Need for Trained Men; Back Course Here

"The Hotelmen of Pennsylvania are more than proud of the rapid progress and the splendid development of the hotel administration course at Penn State."

This statement by Frank V. Hynes, executive secretary of the Pennsylvania Hotel Association, sums up enthusiastic statements issued by prominent state hotelmen about Penn State's newest venture into special vocation courses.

Founded here two years ago under the direction of Miss Phyllis K. Sprague, the hotel management course is perhaps as well, if not better, known among hotelmen of the state than within the student body. Contact is maintained between the students and hotelmen by means of frequent field trips, regular round table conferences, and summer practice work in hotels and restaurants.

Mr. Hynes, who is in constant contact with hotelmen throughout the state, went on to say, "business friends today call for trained hotel personnel and it is felt by the lead-

ers of the industry that such specialized courses as offered by Penn State and other leading universities are no longer an experiment but an absolute necessity."

Courses of study in the hotel administration curriculum range from cookery to business law. Students are given intensive training in chemistry, meat judging, and accountancy. The Penn State course is reputed to have the best training in the preparation of foods of any hotel course in the country.
