Tops Delta Chi And Sigma Pi In Close Count

Narrowly topping the intramural point totals of Delta Chi and Sigma Pi, Delta Upsilon was selected yesterday as recipient of the coveted Intramural Athletic Trophy by the intramural board

Competition between the three organizations was so close that results were carefully checked and rechecked to avoid mistake, according to Paul E. Geis, president of the board

First place in the mushball tourney and second place in swimming competition helped to capture first place for Delta Upsilon. Delta Chi was second and Sigma Pi third.

Other groups near the top have not yet been announced by the board

Presentation of the trophy has been tentatively scheduled for the pep rally on Friday, October 13

Sixty-three teams were entered in the race for the award, which is presented by the School of Physical Education and Athletics

'Dutch' Meyer Says Forward Pass Not Dangerous Offense

The football pass is less dangerous and treacherous than ground plays, in the opinion of L. R. (Dutch) Meyer, coach of the undefeated 1938 football team at Texas Christian University

In most parts of the Southwest, Meyer said today in an article in The Saturday Evening Post, the pass is a normal part of the offense, "not a dangerous maneuver to be used sparingly and in faint hope," and he backs that up with the figures that in 1938 the Progs passed 229 times and in 11 games lost the ball only seven times by interception, but 17 times by fumbles

"Throughout 1938 pass plays were the safest thing we tried," Meyer says in the article

"Only two things are necessary to unlimber the bombers: One is to have a team on the field. The other is to have possession of the leather anywhere on the field."
