**IMA Hatmen To Differ From Existing Societies**

Declaring that the proposed hat society of the IMA "is being organized to honor those men who have done most for the furtherance of non-fraternity men and those who have been active in extra-curricular work," the Central Council of the IMA immediately spiked rumors that their movement was in any way similar to existing hat societies.

Such was the action taken at a meeting held at the Lions Club Wednesday night when the IMA definitely decided upon the plans for the organization of a new campus honor society. Announcement of the committee and final vote will be taken on the matter at the next meeting at Locust Lane Lodge October 26.

The clarification of the purposes of the IMA society thus leaves the way paved for furtherance of the independent movement on the campus. Plans are already being formulated for affiliation with the national independent organization and will be announced as soon as the local group considers itself securely established.

Two new units, Penn Haven and Atherton Street Dormitory, were admitted into membership, making a total enrollment of nearly 1350 non-fraternity men within the organization.

President Clarence H. Evans '40 quelled reports that the IMA is not affiliated with the Independent Party by explaining the purpose of the founding of the body. He stated that it is to foster closer relationships between non-fraternity men socially, athletically, and for representation in student government affairs. He quoted the constitution which states, "This organization shall refrain from participation in politics."
