

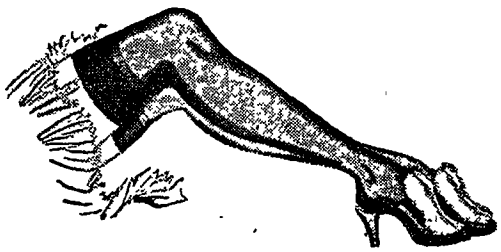

Busby Q. Butterfinger Makes Thrilling Escape

BERLIN, GERMANY—March 14—A bullet-riddled Nazi sergeant's uniform, found today on the banks of the Rhine River, was the only evidence of the thrilling escape from a concentration camp near the capital of Busby Q Butterfinger late last night

Officials of the Gestapo, Nazi secret police, were searching the lowlands today for Butterfinger's body. The famous American publicist expertly escaped from the camp, where he had been imprisoned for derogatory remarks against Adolph Hitler, in a manner typical of the colorful life he has lived since gaining nationwide publicity as "The Great American Mouth."

Butterfinger, slated to handle All-College Circus at Penn State All-college Circus at Penn State on April 27, made his escape early last night when, disguised in a Nazi sergeant's uniform, he calmly walked through the prison gates. Officials at the bastille, on discovering his escape, immediately sent out the alarm, and patrols were formed to return the vociferous American to his cell.

Early in the morning the report came through official sources that Butterfinger had been spotted by a patrol on the banks of the Rhine and had been shot down. All that could be found however, was the bullet-ridden uniform. What happened to Butterfinger is still a mystery to Nazi police.
