State-Wide Production Shows Definite Slump

Dr George L Leffler, assistant professor of economics and assistant director of Penn State's monthly Business Survey, recently completed a \$200 Grant-In-Aid Survey which revealed that Pennsylvania industries have shrunk in manufacturing output since 1914 Because the center of population has been moving west, Dr Leffler explained, Pennsylvania's share of the national total of manufactured products has dropped from 119 per cent in 1914 to 99 in 1937 20 Industries Decrease


