

### Minimum Of Five Credits Required For Residence

In order for the six weeks of actual residence during one summer session to be counted as fulfilling residence requirements, a minimum of five credits must be taken. For periods of less than six weeks' duration the maximum residence counted shall be one week per credit of approved study.

### Home Ec Slates Open Meetings

#### Garden Party Scheduled For Summer Sessions

A series of five open meetings sponsored by the department of home economics are scheduled for this coming Summer Session. These meetings will be held in Room 110 Home Economics auditorium.

A garden party to welcome summer session students interested in home economics will be held on July 3 in the nursery school garden. The faculty of the department of home economics will be hostesses.

On July 10 Amanda Ebersole, associate professor of home economics in the Drexel Institute of Technology, will talk on "The Workshop Looks at Education for Home and Family Living."

On July 13 Dr. Pauline Beery Mack, director of research in home economics, will talk on "The Technologies and Sciences of Home Economics Research."

Amy G. Gardner, director of art in adult education, State Department of Public Instruction, Dover, Del., will be the lecturer on July 20. Miss Gardner's topic has not been announced as yet.

### French Teachers Attend Summer Session Institute

Because of the unsettled conditions now prevailing in Europe, the French teacher's nearest approach to travel and study with experienced instructors whose mother tongue is French is the Institute of French Education.

Even in times of peace in Europe, most teachers of French in American schools have found such institutes more economical and better suited to their special needs and preparation than foreign travel. Not that a trip to France in times of peace is to be discouraged. However, many teachers who have gone there with the hope of improving their ability to speak French fluently come back disappointed because they had not been prepared to face the countless minor difficulties which such an undertaking implies.

**The Program**

The course offerings have been carefully selected and coordinated to meet the special needs of teachers and students working for certification in Pennsylvania and other states, or for advanced degrees. The courses give excellent preparation for the New York state examination for approval of oral work in French. This examination, usually given in August, may be taken in State College.

In addition to the formal academic work, numerous evening lectures are planned at which outstanding French educators and writers will discuss the current economic, political, social, and religious problems which confront France today. The historical background of the country and the consequent reasons for her present attitude toward the Allied and Central Powers will be considered also.

**No English Rule**

The principle of the exclusive use of the French language in and out of the classroom will be observed strictly. This is the very base of the pedagogic structure of the Institute. However, it is the desire of the Institute to welcome not only students already proficient in French conversation, but also those who, in spite of several years of French study, have not had a sufficient opportunity for oral practice.

The French Institute will occupy again this Summer, Grange Dormitory, where it is possible to accommodate all students and teachers of the Institute. The members will have at their disposal the College Library, which contains a large number of volumes dealing with classical and modern French literature, French history, art and civilization. This collection has been enriched recently by a 10,000-franc gift of the French government. The Institute has a library of its own where textbooks of all types and teaching equipment of special interest to teachers of French have been collected.

**Visiting Faculty**

The Institute is fortunate in having obtained the services of a young and brilliant French novelist, Frederic Urmatt, who will teach a regular course on the contemporary French novel. He will also deliver six general evening lectures on questions of immediate interest.

Frederic Urmatt is one of the most promising young French writers of today. A few years ago he was awarded for his novel, "La Damnation de Georges Bruckner," the Grand Prix de l'Alsace Littéraire. His last novel, "Les Possédés du Saint-Esprit," was well received.

This will not be his first visit to the United States. During the winter of 1938-39 he gave a series of lectures in the eastern states.

### Make-Up Course Summer Feature

**Demonstrations Valuable To Directors And Women**

Anyone engaged in producing plays should have a good course in make-up because of its difficult technique. The division of dramatics has engaged for the Summer Session one of the finest make-up men of the country, Aaron Zauder. Last summer Mr. Zauder gave a series of make-up demonstrations which met with the approval of everyone who worked with him. Knowing now exactly what the student needs he will be even better prepared to give a course in make-up. Mr. Zauder will be on the campus during the third week of the main Summer Session.

It takes a real knowledge of the dramatic as well as skill in the application of cosmetics to use these properly. If one sits close to the stage in the average amateur play, one is amazed at the very bad make-up of the actors. Rouge is put on the wrong places or smeared over the face, eyebrows are arched when they should be straight, wrinkles look like so many smudges, and beads attached so precariously that the audience is sure they will fall off during the play, and often they do.
